

"With courage, commitment, and confidence"

The past months have been a rough ride: membership figures are falling rapidly in all churches – even though there are no new scandals. And then there are lamentations and sighs, ritual mourning and assigning of blame, perplexity on all sides – and, of course, the know-it-alls. There are prophets of doom and apocalypse, and admonitions that now is the final opportunity to at last fashion the Church in such a way that it becomes attractive, relevant, fascinating, contemporary, and socially sensitive.

The Covid crisis is also revelatory for Christian Hennecke. And what is revealed is more than just a crisis: the criticism of the Church's silence and the question of its relevance to the system is telling and crucial. Should the Church be integrated into this social system and thus become indispensable? For whom? What exactly is meant by this?

These questions form the foundation for Christian Hennecke's reflections on the Church. He endeavours to break out of this paralysing framework and urges that there be new modes of action. Renewal is needed, not simply reform. That is what it is in essence. It is about moving beyond the clerical discussions of authority, which themselves go no further than democratising this authority but then dividing it up among themselves and distributing it to others.





This book is an invitation: It encourages Christians to seek out the dialogue with Muslims in a way that allows them to maintain their own convictions' claim of truth while meeting Muslims with openness and curiosity. It works because Ralf Wüstenberg introduces a structured model of dialogue – the "dialogue pyramid" – a step-by-step path on which the conversation between devout believers can be shaped.

Beginning at the cognitive dialogue, that deals with the outer appearance of religion, the path leads to the empathetic dialogue, appreciating the piousness of the other, and then towards the spiritual dialogue which ideally lays bare joint roots within a shared ur-soil.

The perspective of this book always remains a Christian one, the argument's vanishing point always tangible: The Christian teachings of Jesus provide the content on which the author bases the possibilities of the "dialogue pyramid".
