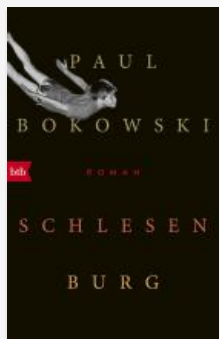

"Silesia Towers" tells the story of refugees and natives, homelessness and finding a new home. A warm-hearted and bittersweet novel about the dream of fitting in and leading a good life – and about whether you can belong anywhere, if you don't know where you've come from.

"Silesia Towers' is what they called it, our community on the edge of the city, where the Galówkas' flat burnt down in the summer of '89. Sixty families lived there, nearly all from Poland. And then, suddenly, we were worried: what if Romanians or Russian Germans move in? Half the estate looked down its nose at the building where they housed asylum seekers. They were so proud of themselves for having left it behind. That was the year the new girl moved into the estate, Darius disappeared and Mother read nothing but Heinz Konsalik novels, the year I realised – too late – that Father had his own plans for the burnt-out flat..."

The way Bokowski entices us to come out and play, to venture into the dreams and miseries of childhood, makes this a

There's a family of squirrels living in the trees surrounding the villa on Hamburg's Lake Alster. While the humans observe the squirrels, the squirrels are busy observing the humans. And they wonder about them. They wonder not only about the scientist couple that lives in the villa – and their passion for music, literature and art – but about humanity as a whole. Then something happens in the Hambach Forest, which shows that if humans and animals work together for a common cause, the impossible becomes possible. They have saved one forest, and now they want to save the whole planet. So they gather in Vitopia for a conference. The squirrels know that we need them as much as they need us: "We're all in the same boat, a boat called Earth. And we have to make sure it doesn't sink."

In her new book, Ulla Hahn tackles one of life's big questions: why do humans destroy the things they love, despite knowing better? How can we turn the ship around? "The Vitopia Conference" is a novel bursting with imagination and wordplay, full of curiosity about everything that has ever been thought, and about what we could achieve, if only we realised that the Earth belongs to everyone, and everyone belongs to the Earth.

The ferry takes an hour for the crossing from the mainland to the little North Sea island – sometimes longer, depending on how rough the sea is. The Sander family has lived in one of the island's two villages for nearly 300 years. Hanne has raised three children, while her husband has given up both his family and his seafaring life. Now her oldest son has lost his captain's licence, is plagued by premonitions and tidal data, and is waiting for the storm to end all storms. Her daughter Eske looks after veteran sailors and widows at the old people's home. She fears the influx of tourists more than the sea, because the tourists are turning the island's culture into mere folklore. Only Henrik, Hanne's youngest son, is at peace with himself. He is the first man in the family never to have dreamt of going to sea, and instead spends his time collecting flotsam on the beach. Over the course of one year, the Sander family's life is irrevocably changed – by an almost unnoticeable breeze that eventually grows into a full-blown storm.

"I hadn't thought of my mother for years. I thought (and, yes, hoped) that our relationship was over once and for all. Had the past come back to haunt me? I suddenly realised that you can't tear yourself away from your roots, no matter how hard you try."

The last time Henry Kaplan heard from his mother was ten years ago. Then he gets a call from Frankfurt's University Hospital: his mother is on the ITU. She collapsed at a train station and is in a coma, and he's listed as her emergency contact. The Black Forest antique dealer decides to travel to Frankfurt to visit her. He needs all the courage he can get to make this journey, which awakens painful memories: the first time his mother left him, he was four. She got into a waiting taxi and drove off without a word to start a new life without him. After a few months at his grandmother's, Henry is sent to a foster home – just one of the many traumatic experiences in his life. Can you turn back time, just like that? Can you simply erase a lifelong feeling of abandonment, disappointment and hurt? Henry Kaplan realises that this might be an opportunity for him. And that, perhaps, he'll only ever truly be free if he can bring himself to forgive his mother.

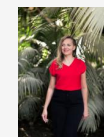

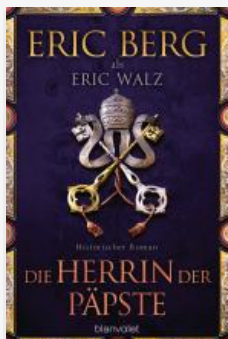

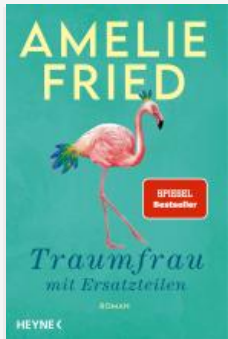
