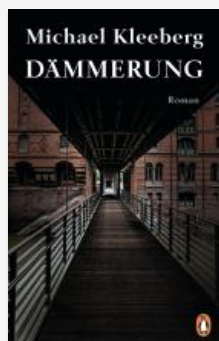

It's Karlmann 'Charly' Renn's sixtieth birthday, and he's having a big knees-up to celebrate. What he also does is take stock – with his characteristic complacency and stubbornness, and without sentimentality. As always, he refuses to give in to the rampant groupthink around him without a fight.

What he thinks of as a second youth is overshadowed by thoughts of what he has irredeemably lost. But Charly knows nothing if not how to protect himself from overwhelming emotions. It's a skill he needs desperately now, because his self-esteem is being sorely tested indeed: not only by Covid, but also by his father's impending death and the conflicted relationship with his own children, who have long fled the roost. Michael Kleeberg, born in 1959, studied political science and history. After stints in Rome and Amsterdam, he lived in Paris between 1986 and 1999. He now lives in Berlin, where he freelances as a writer and translator and has received several awards for his literary work. His most important books include "A Garden in the North", "The King of Corsica", "Karlmann" and "Vaterjahre". His novel "The American Hospital" was nominated for the German Book Prize. In 2016, Kleeberg won the prestigious Konrad Adenauer Foundation's Literature Prize for authors whose work has "helped to establish human freedom and dignity".

Written with a light touch, "The Last Lover" is both psychologically insightful and stylish.

Former chemistry professor and womanizer Carl Kruger is lonely. He and Helen were married for more than half a century, and lived in this New York suburb for almost as long. After Helen's death, though, his adopted daughter Lisa and grandson Collin persuade him to join them on a trip to his old home country. For Carl, the journey turns into an encounter with a long-suppressed past: his family's escape from the Polish town of Sopot, his childhood in East Germany, the two brothers who are so very different from himself. As the threesome travel through a changing world, Carl wonders: has he, an 'old white man', actually made it into the twenty-first century?

Her brilliance as a storyteller comes down to her three-dimensional characters, a great sense of narrative timing, and hidden plots which it is a sheer joy to discover.

They grieve for the dead, but never lose their lust for life – not to mention their sense of humour.

Seventy years later, Osman travels to Israel in search of her family's past. Who were these two people, who raised her father on the run? What was the trip like which invisibly, but decisively, affected her own youth?

Fiction and biography merge as Osman seeks to salvage her family's story – an imaginative and delightfully funny novel, where the ghosts of the past come to dance.
