Martin Buber is known today primarily as the translator of the Hebrew Bible and as the philosopher who made critical contributions to the philosophy of dialogue with his work "I and Thou" exactly 100 years ago. What has rarely been appreciated until now is that Buber not only overcame the subject orientation of idealism through thinking in terms of the Other, he was also an outspoken "philosopher of community" who emphasized the responsibility of the individual for others.

The Bohemian Utraquismus as a Denomination in the 16th Century

Becoming a denomination during the Reformation

Volume 100 of the Reformation research series QuFRG focuses on the history of the Bohemian Reformation in its early modern European context. In the 15th and 16th centuries, the majority of the Bohemian population belonged to a national church founded by Jan Hus and his associates. Celebrating Holy Communion in both forms and consequently referred to as Utraquists, the members of this church were able to achieve a status legitimized by particular and national law on the fringes of the papal church. While considered schismatics and merely tolerated, the Utraquists saw themselves as legitimate members of the Roman Church. However, from its inception the Wittenberg Reformation, exerting an increasing influence, started a process that would lead to the majority of the Utraquists professing the Reformation, as articulated in the 1575 *Confessio Bohemica*. This study is the first to closely examine the relevant source material, most of which was still untranslated, and to reconstruct how Bohemian Utraquism evolved from a primarily ritually and liturgically deviant manifestation of Latin European Christianity into its own particular Reformation denomination through its interactions with the Wittenberg Reformation. In addition, the distinctive characteristics of the Bohemian Reformation are examined.
