

What we know as competitive sport today was invented by a white male elite at the end of the nineteenth century, when they founded clubs for sporting gentlemen, organised competitions and measured feats in centimetres and seconds. The Olympic Games celebrated sport with the motto 'The most important thing is not winning, but taking part', but in truth, many people have been prevented from joining in. In the hundred years or so since then, the excluded – people with a disability, women, people of colour, LGBTQ+ people, Jews, Muslims and others – have fought hard to become part of world sport. In fact, some are still struggling. Finally, "Taking Part Would Be Everything" tells the history of sport from their perspective – including that of Battling Siki, the first African-born boxing world champion; Alfonsina Strada, the first woman ever to ride the Giro d'Italia; and champion athlete Caster Semenya, who was born with DSD and has been fighting discrimination for years. Muse, secretary, wife: these are some of the labels used to describe the women whose influence on history has been erased. Their achievements have brought honour and fame to the men close to them - such as Karl Marx, Bertolt Brecht and Albert Einstein, who couldn't have done what they did without their female friends, daughters or lovers – but they themselves remain largely unknown. The list includes scientists like Rosalind Franklin and Lise Meitner, who, unlike their male colleagues, were never celebrated for their discoveries; and authors and artists like Marie Hirsch, Lou Andreas-Salomé and Hedwig Thun, who hid behind male pseudonyms all their lives in order to be taken seriously. Bondarev argues that what is important now is that we think things over carefully, and show ourselves willing to support Russia – and especially its people – as it finds its way back to democracy.

Boris Bondarev, born in 1980, worked for the Russian foreign ministry for two decades. He has been an advisor on nuclear non-proliferation and worked in Cambodia and Mongolia, and joined the Russian Federation's permanent mission to the UN in Geneva in 2019. The world is changing. The US is no longer dominant, and China and India are emerging as new centres of power in a multipolar world. The approaching end of the Pax Americana means that Europeans now face a huge challenge. How do we deal with the emergence of these new powers? There is a growing danger that we won't be able to do without new enemies, and where once the struggle was between 'Christians and heathens'. 'the civilised world and barbarians'. 'freedom versus communism' and 'Western Christian culture versus Islam', the face-off now seems to be between 'democracy' and 'autocracy'.

This treatise attempts to show that the supposed 'systemic rivalry' between China and other countries may be a rivalry, but is not systemic. In the twenty-first century, it is our duty to drop those old friend/foe juxtapositions and acknowledge and open ourselves up to different cultures and different ways for a country to evolve. We will only be able to protect and preserve human rights – which are not 'essential' rights – if we truly and wholly live up to them. Tolerance, diversity and openness are something we can only demand if we ourselves practise them. For the first time in history, all of humanity finds itself in the same boat, as we face a global environmental catastrophe; and we can only overcome it and avoid bringing about our own destruction, if we focus on what all countries and cultures share.

Spring, 2022. In the middle of the path, in the searing midday sun, lies a baby marten. She is hungry and lost. But today is a lucky day for Lotta: someone finds her and takes her to Wolfgang 'Woid Woife' Schreil, who has already helped countless orphaned and injured woodland animals find their way back to their wild, free life. 
